Digital Economy Bill Threatens One Click

For a pressure group and internet raw news hub such as One Click, the passage of the Digital Economy Bill in Britain has become both personal and highly political for me. Equally, the bill's corrosively flawed passage is set to cause civil unrest in Britain and put our economy and national security at risk just before the General Election. This piece of wash-up unconscionable arrogance and unforgivable folly is the creature of unelected Labour government aide Peter Mandelson, oft-detested by colleagues and opposition alike throughout his political career.

The European Commission has defined internet access as a fundamental human right. The Digital Economy Bill is a direct contravention of this right.
