[St Paul's Cathedral orchestrating violence against the Occupy movement](#)

On 15 October Canon Dr Giles Fraser allowed the protesters at camp OccupyLSX to reside in the St Paul's Cathedral courtyard where they had been kettled and forced to remain by the aggressive tactics of the riot police. This decision has cost him his job.

"It is with great regret and sadness that I have handed in my notice at St Paul's Cathedral", [tweeted](#) Canon Dr Giles Fraser, (now ex) Chancellor of St Paul's Cathedral this morning. In a short statement he said: "I resigned because I believe that the chapter has set on a course of action that could mean there will be violence in the name of the church."

St Paul's and the City of London Corporation combined have [set up a meeting](#) for Friday to hear legal advice about how to physically destroy camp OccupyLSX, one of the London branches of the vastly popular Occupy movement taking place in over 900 cities around the globe.

Orchestrating this aggressive stance towards the peaceful protesters has been St Paul's Cathedral Dean, one Graeme Knowles, previously running religion over at the Isle of Man, a notorious tax haven for the super-rich.

Determined to force the protesters out and presumably backed by the [cathedral's Trustees](#) including bankers and an ex-Commissioner of the Metropolitan Police who represent the acme of the privileged 1% elite, Knowles closed the cathedral down with absolutely no justification last week only to decide to reopen it tomorrow after the protesters called his bluff by refusing to quit.

Instead of seizing a golden opportunity to plug itself into the zeitgeist of today by supporting the Occupy movement, the church top hierarchy has refuted the rationale of its very own existence by siding with the God of Mammon instead.

Even for the Anglican Church, what has transpired over the last few days has been a PR disaster of biblical proportions. Largely considered one of life's irrelevancies with congregation numbers falling steeply by the year, the church has consistently been hit by fractious discord and secrecy with the paedophile clergy scandal being yet another filthy mark on its decidedly grubby escutcheon.
