**Formal complaint against Professor David M Salisbury
Director of Immunisation, Department of Health (and others).
On fitness to practice and professional conduct matters.**

My name is Bill Welsh; I am grandfather to an autistic boy and am serving this complaint in a personal capacity, although you should note that I am also President of Autism Treatment Trust in Edinburgh. My clinic in Scotland has to date comprehensively tested over 300 autistic children and the revealing results of this work will hopefully be presented quite soon to government ministers.

The enclosed complaint is against eleven British doctors. It is comprehensive and is fully explained within the document. A list of six specific charges is on page 16. They include serious and repeated mistakes in the management of the vaccination programme; an apparent acquiescence in potentially unethical procedures which may be illegal; and an aloof detachment from a part of the population the eleven doctors should serve, sick children.

Named are some of our most senior public health officials, seven of whom are privileged to hold the nation's highest honour. Their individual and collective indifference in the knowledge that previously perfect British children have lost the gift of meaningful and intelligent life brings shame on a once proud profession. Their unforgivable apathy toward the plight of thousands of innocent children will long leave a stain on the annals of medicine and public health in the UK. History will condemn these men for their inexcusable inaction. Not one of them has publicly called for urgent medical investigation of regressive autistic children, for fear, it would seem, of implicating the vaccination programme.

Please note I will be calling over 1,000 witnesses in support of this complaint.
